

SLA

SLA cares for and supports nearly 600 destitute children in India. We provide funding to a grass roots non-government organisation (NGO) partner who runs two Home-cum-Schools in Tuni and Hyderabad. The children we support are aged between newborn and 18 years old. Often they come to us after a traumatic experience, such as the death of both parents. Some have been rescued from beggar masters, house slavery, bonded labour or child prostitution; all are vulnerable and living below the poverty line.

We provide them with a secure home giving them shelter, food, clothes, medicine and education which brings them security, dignity and love. Once the children turn 18 we try to ensure that as many as possible will continue onto further education and achieve a degree or vocational qualification which gives them independence in adult life and enables them to escape the poverty trap.

Our joint vision with our NGO partner is to provide each child with the life skills and education necessary to develop their potential, to lead independent lives and to realise their dreams.

VOLUNTEERS FOR SLA

For its first decade SLA depended on a small group of volunteers who willingly helped when and wherever needed. Their contribution was vital and continues to be highly valued.

TEAMS

Edinburgh Fundraising Team (EFT); will initiate and respond to ideas and develop and co ordinate new and existing events to raise money in line with ethos and guidelines of SLA. It will liaise with ET & CT and also organise particular events at the request of the Trustees.

Catering Team (CT); to provide catering support at events where appropriate, working in conjunction with EFT & ET.

Resource Team; to facilitate recruitment of volunteers, maintain data base of

registration of volunteers, organise informal meetings with potential volunteers and facilitate move to teams.

Events Team (ET); to provide practical support with the appropriate number of volunteers to set up, staff and clear up at events, working with EFG & CT teams prior during and after events.

Speakers & Sales Team; Provide speakers to give talks about SLA to groups as requested and people to man the sales table at talks.

Street/Shop Collection Team; to provide manpower to support the annual Valentine's Day street collection and develop the project of collection tins in shops.
