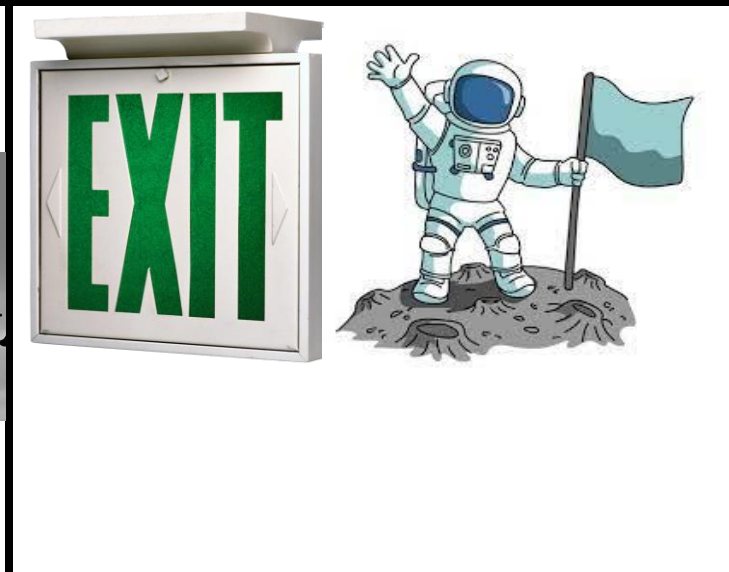

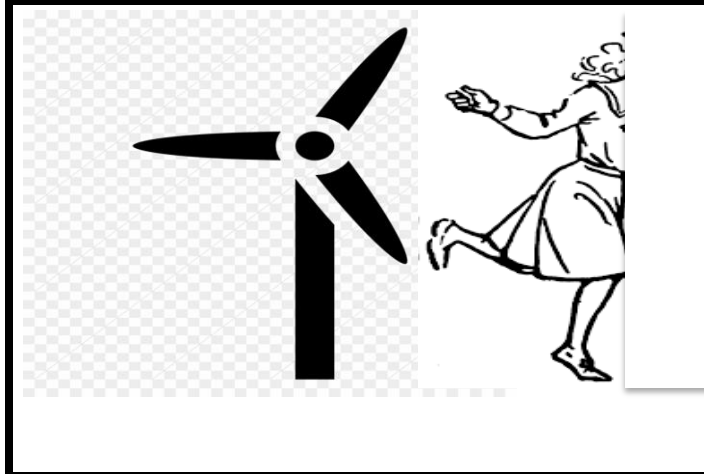
1. ANSWER Thorn – Birds
"The thorn birds" by Colleen McCullough



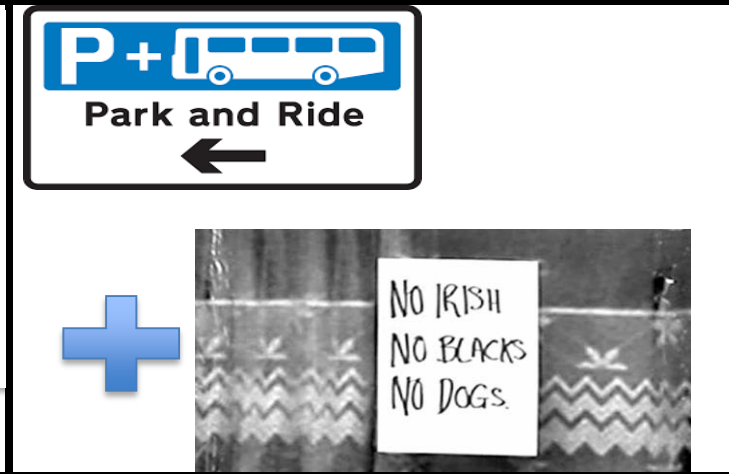
2. ANSWER Exit/Out - Lander

"Jane Eyre" by Charlotte Bronte



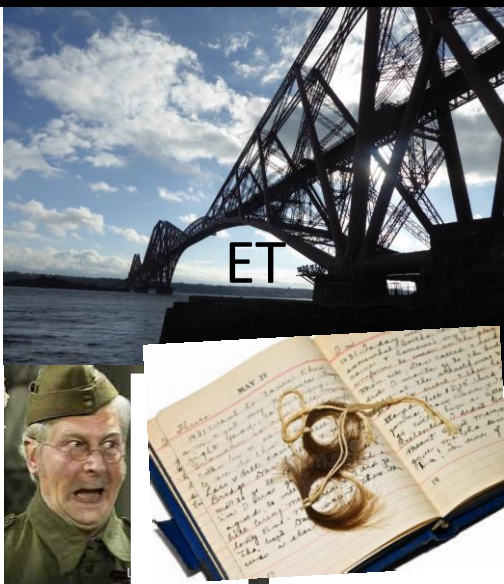
4. ANSWER Wind – Going

 “Princess Bride” by William Goldman

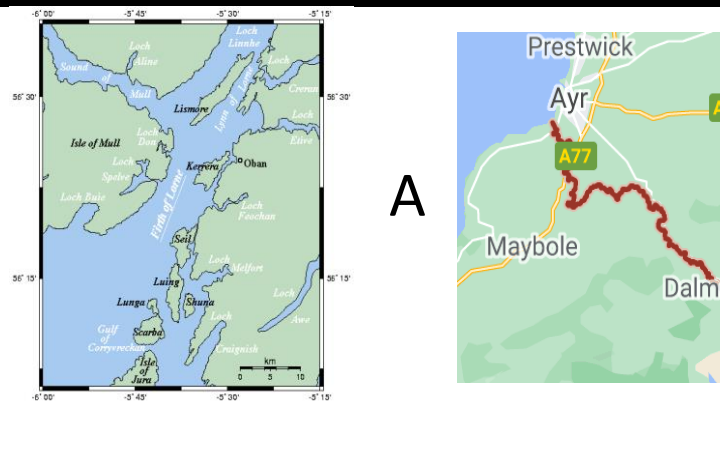
